

CHAPTER 14
LAW ENFORCEMENT POLICIES

1-14-1: HUBER LAW PRISONERS

Pursuant to §303.08, Wis. Stats., the judges of the Courts of Green County have the right to grant the motion of a prisoner to serve his/her sentence under the Huber Law; and if said privilege is granted by the court, the Sheriff shall endeavor to secure employment for said prisoner; and, if employment is secured by the Sheriff, he/she becomes the keeper of the prisoners' earnings and disburses them in accordance with said Statute. Said Statute provides that if a prisoner is gainfully employed, he/she is liable for the cost of his/her board in the jail, and the cost of the board of Huber Law and all other prisoners shall be as from time to time established by the Green County Board of Supervisors, while so gainfully employed. 1-14-2: LAW ENFORCEMENT COMPACT AUTHORITY

The Green County Board hereby approves in principle the plan whereby County law enforcement units enter into reciprocal agreements to provide mutual assistance in the event of emergencies of such magnitude that the law enforcement unit of one particular County finds it impossible to handle, under authority of §66.0313, Wis. Stats., and the Green County Sheriff is authorized and directed to negotiate with the sheriffs of Wisconsin counties a detailed plan to implement the general purpose stated herein, in the event of emergency and when authorized by the Sheriff or his/her subordinate, members of the Green County Sheriff's Department are authorized and directed to perform enforcement work and other work related to public health and safety beyond the territorial limits of the County. When enforcement personnel are assigned to duty beyond the territorial limits of Green County under emergency circumstances as are provided herein, the Sheriff shall, within ten (10) days, make an appropriate report to the Green County Board.
