September 18, 2019

### Minutes

Meeting called to order by Chair Larry Heindel at 9:00 a.m.

Motion by Kent Anderson, seconded Leif Spilde to approve the agenda, with the omission of item #5.

Motion by Leif Spilde to approve the minutes of the June 19, 2019 meeting. Motion carried.

Nomination of New Members – Motion by Kent Anderson seconded by Dan Smits to nominate and approve: Laurie Cannova –Badger State Ethanol, Mike Hall – Monroe Clinic, Scott Dilley-Alliant Energy and Dan Dilley – Colony Brands as members of the LEPC. Motion carried.

Review of the Hazardous Material Strategic Plan – Tanna McKeon reviewed the current Hazardous Material Strategic Plan.

Review and Approval of Facility Plans – Tanna McKeon distributed copies of the Facility Plans for the following facilities for review: R. R. Donnelly, New Glarus Brewery Co. “HT”, New Glarus Brewery Co. “RT”, Stoughton Trailers and Badger State Ethanol. Motion by Dan Smits, seconded by Kent Anderson to approve the Facility Plans. Motion carried.

Reports from Committee Members:

Kent Anderson: He will be attending a WEM instructors workshop in a few weeks. ICS300 will be changing from a 16-hour class to 24 hours. He will be teaching an ICS 300 class in Belleville in October through November. SWIMT has not been meeting very often and they have not been busy, which is a good thing.

Dan Smits: There have been a lot of gas leaks caused by contractors. The incident at Sun Prairie was a wakeup call on how serious this can get. The warm weather we had prevented migration of the gas and avoided evacuations and WE energies resolved the leaks quickly.

Mike Hall- Monroe Clinic will be having their fall drill on October 1, 2019. This will test an influx of patients into their emergency department. The scenario they are using is a train derailment and spill/fire of ethanol.

RoAnn Warden – A Point of Dispensing (POD) workshop will be held Sept. 26, sponsored by the SW WI Hospital Readiness Coalition. She wants nursing homes and Monroe Clinic to partner with GC Public Health to partner with them. If there should be a pandemic PODS can get their employees, their families and clients vaccinated and receive medication. (this will help keep critical facilities open) If other agencies would like to be a POD they can contact the Health Department. The flu season is not expected to be bad this year. The flu vaccine is beginning to be available. E-cigarettes are a major health problem. Young adults and those in their 20's have become ill or died from vaping. Larry Heindel said the school district has alerted the bus drivers to be on the lookout for kids vaping on the busses. RoAnn also commented that e-cigarettes constantly change to disguise how they look.

Chris Narveson – Green Co. was not heavily impacted by the heavy rain last week, although we have a couple of roads with water over them. Lafayette County had many roads and a bridge that was replaced in 2017 washed out. County T south of Brodhead floods regularly. There isn't a lot of money to make repairs, especially on our bridges.

Laurie Cannova – Appreciated being the on LEPC again and having us tour Badger State Ethanol.

Tanna McKeon – A mass casualty incident class will be held in November at Green Co. EMS. This will be in preparation for a series of exercises in 2020-21. ICS300 classes will be in Belleville over a 4-week period in October-November. A functional exercise will be held in Bellville on Thursday, Sept. 19. The scenario is a transportation accident with a possible release of ammonia. The exercise is a Dane/Green Counties joint exercise.

Dan Smits also commented that the facility plans need to be more accessible to fire departments during an emergency. (The plans are given to the fire departments). Perhaps some hazmat information could be put on county GIS maps or knox boxes at the facility could store the plans and maps of facilities as well. Tanna said she would contact the county GIS and see what could be done. Special facilities are on a map layers now.

Motion by Chris Narveson seconded RoAnn Warden to close the meeting and members of the committee enjoyed a tour of Badger State Ethanol.
